Overview

Literary Arts seeks experienced teaching artists living in the Portland and Salem-Keizer metro areas with backgrounds in education and writing to join our roster of writers for the 2021-22 school year.

WITS pairs local writers with classroom teachers to lead creative writing residencies for public high school students. Our WITS program currently serves students at schools within Portland Public Schools, Parkrose School District, Gresham-Barlow School District, and Woodburn School District. Residencies take place during the school day and scheduling is unpredictable. Therefore, this role requires a flexible schedule of at least three full mornings or afternoon per week during the academic year. Being on the roster does not guarantee a residency assignment, although we typically can assign writers at least one placement per year.

We are committed to building a teaching artist roster that reflects the diversity of Multnomah County's schools and prefer candidates with demonstrated commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion work through education. Teaching artists identifying as Black, Indigenous, and/or people of color and bilingual writers are especially encouraged to apply. We are also especially interested in adding more slam poets, graphic novel/comics artists, playwrights, journalists, and screenwriters to our roster, and writers from the Salem-Keizer metro.

Responsibilities

- Teaching creative writing residencies (typically 10-15 sessions) to students from diverse backgrounds in variety of classrooms (ex. language arts, English Language Learners, art, media studies, anthropology) and formats (in-person, hybrid, distance learning)
- Attending paid mandatory day-long annual WITS writer orientation in September (Tentative date for 2021: September 2, 8, 11, 15, or 16)
- Maintaining timely communication with WITS staff and school teachers
- Ongoing collaboration with WITS staff, fellow WITS writers, and school partners
- Designing inclusive, responsive well-planned curriculum for high school students
- Providing feedback and encouragement to student writing throughout residency
- Receiving and integrating feedback following classroom observations from WITS staff
- Attending end-of-residency reading and performing your work
