

Internship Openings: @Literary Arts Events Interns

Literary Arts seeks two Events Interns to assist Programs for Writers with the preparation and execution of events at our Central Eastside headquarters at 716 SE Grand Avenue. Applicants from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

Programs for Writers support, promote, and celebrate Oregon's writers and publishers. In addition to the Oregon Book Awards & Fellowships for emerging and established writers, Programs for Writers also offers writing classes, readers seminars, and free literary events at our headquarters in Portland's Central Eastside.

POSITION: @Literary Arts Event Intern (two positions)

DURATION: The internship will start in January 2026 and last through April, 2026. The intern will be expected to be available to support at least 12 events in this time period, including the 2026 Oregon Book Awards Ceremony. The full schedule of events is listed below. This in-person internship primarily takes place in the evenings, between 6PM and 9PM, in our community space and bookstore, located inside Literary Arts' headquarters at 716 SE Grand Avenue.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist with event set-up and take-down for approximately 12-17 events at Literary Arts' Central Eastside headquarters. This includes moving mobile bookshelves, setting up chairs and refreshments (if provided), supporting with tech set-up, fostering a welcoming atmosphere, and troubleshooting as needed to ensure a smooth event.
- Assist with event production at the Oregon Book Awards Ceremony on April 20, 2026.

QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate will have a demonstrated interest in learning more about the non-profit arts sector and producing community events. Qualifications include the ability to make decisions, anticipate needs, and troubleshoot problems. Previous experience with college or community events is helpful but not required.

Come listen to our featured readers, or sign up to share your work in our open mic. Readings will be followed by a short community discussion.

Incite: Queer Writers Read: Incite is a curated, bimonthly reading series for Queer writers. Incite's hope is to create conversation, connection, and greater understanding both within the Queer community and with other communities.
